



#### **Number of Attendees in the Training Programs**




#### **States Where We Conducted at least One Training Program**


#### Other Outcomes Based on Training Programs & Lectures

#### Web Projects:


**PubMed LinkOut:** This is a facility of integrating a library's journal collection details in PubMed. This facility helps users know which articles in a PubMed Search result are available in their own library collection. In India only <u>eight</u> medical libraries have created the LinkOut facility for their users. Out of these we have done the entire project for two libraries (Seth GS Medical College & KEM Hospital and National Institute for Research in Reproductive Health (NIRRH)) and helped two libraries (SDM College, Dharwad, and Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvananthapuram)


## Other Income Relating to Trust Objectives %
