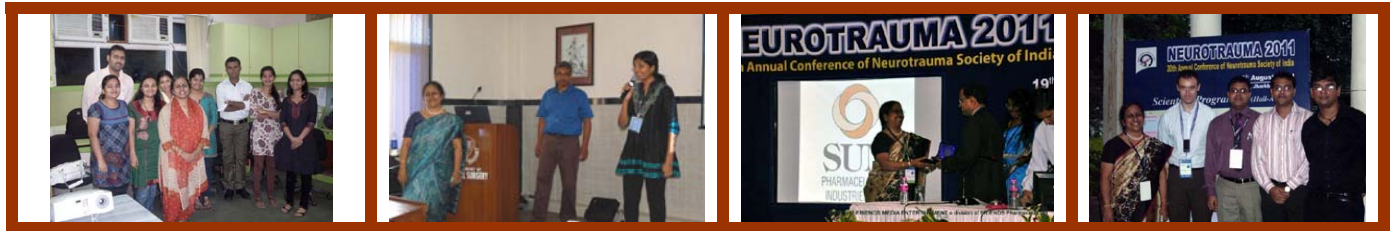

Dear Friends of QMed

I am happy to present to you the Annual Report for the third Financial Year of operations. While we continued to do several workshops and lectures, there are certain highlights of this year that I would like to share. We did preconference workshops in two Undergraduate Student Conferences. We always accept such requests because we believe that if we educate this audience today, they will evolve into better health professionals. I presented a poster at the Annual Cochrane Colloquium this year (held in Madrid, Spain) and again went through several learning opportunities which will translate into better learning for our friends in India. A lecture in a patient oriented audience became a first step towards one of our future plans – patient education in health information literacy. Lectures to FAIMER Fellows (medical teachers who go through this Fellowship work deeply in the areas of improvement of medical education), is turning out to be another method of inculcating the importance of our training, in the medical set up. And finally another first this year was a “Train the Trainer program” for faculty of a medical college. I must admit that this was an experiment; we learned that we need to do much longer duration programs for this project.

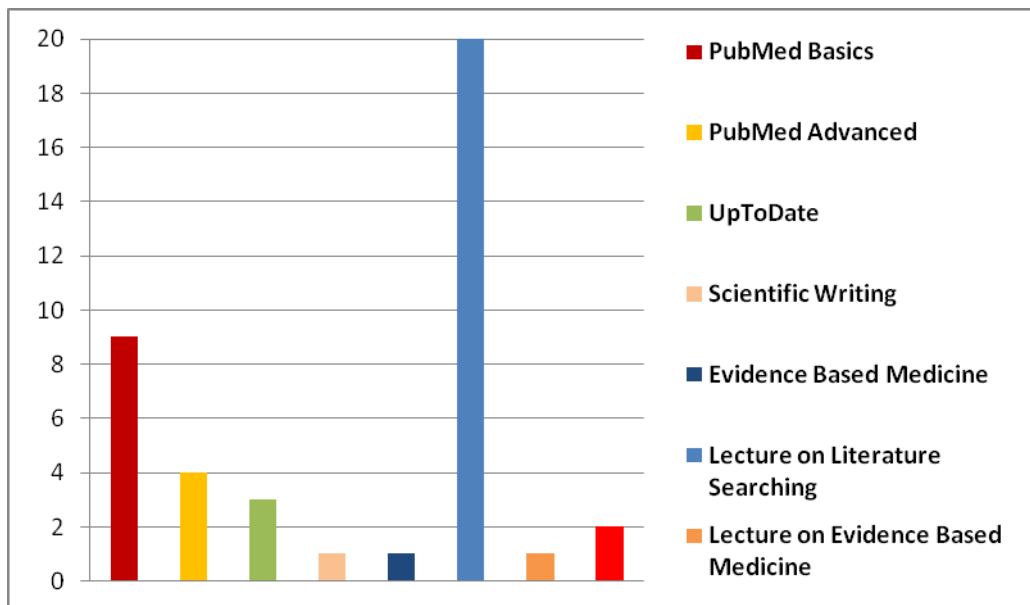

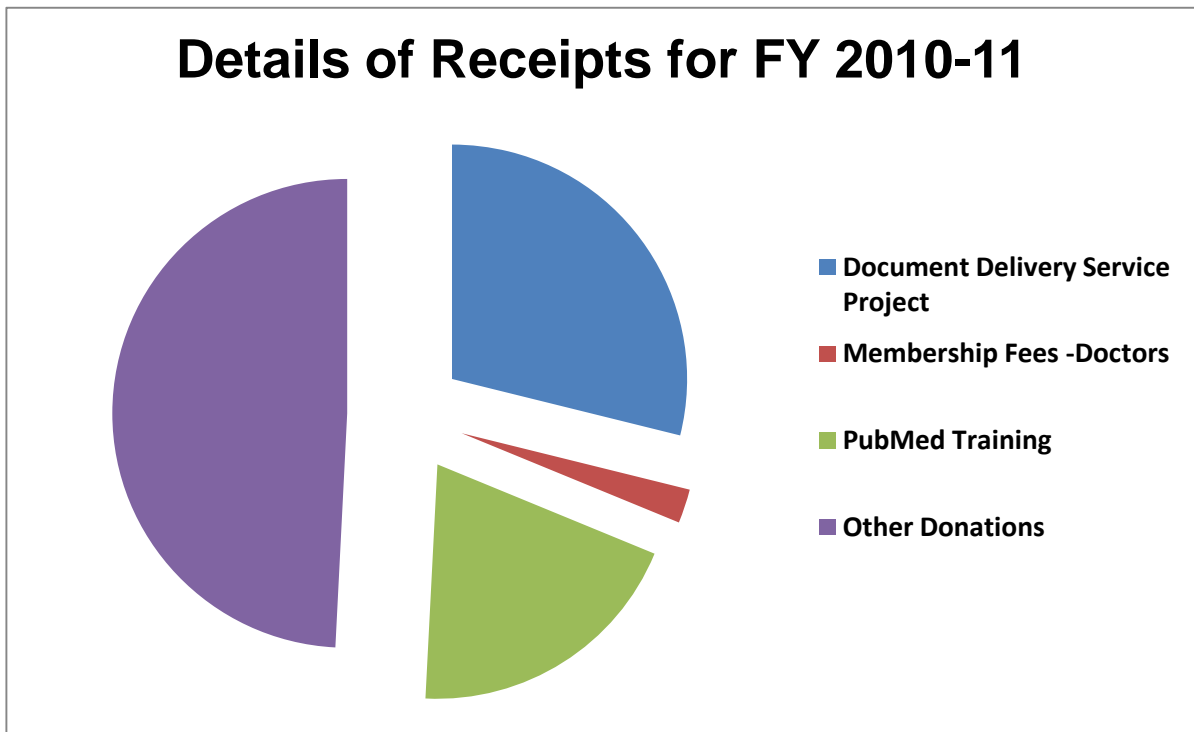

Document Delivery: This year we delivered 800 articles to our individual members and libraries, and 1797 articles to our corporate clients.

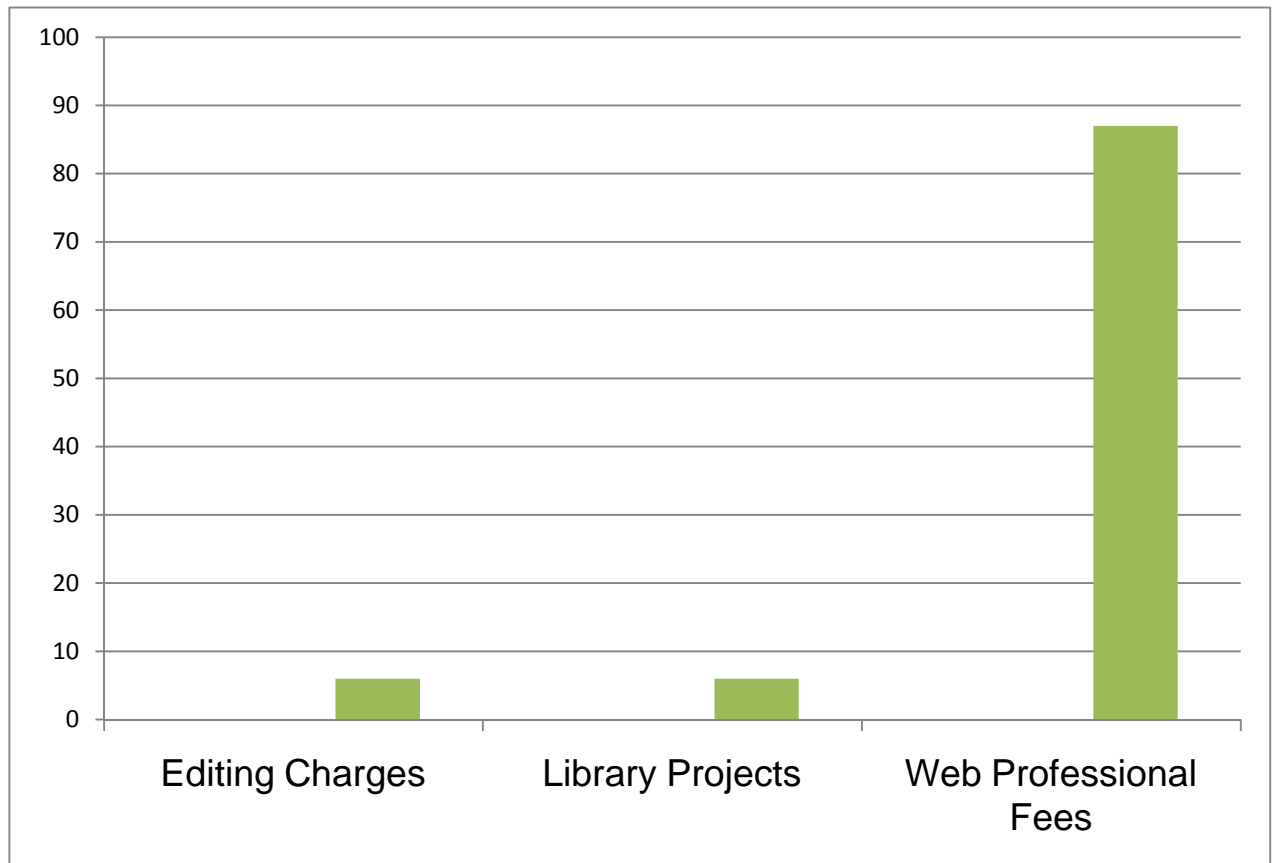

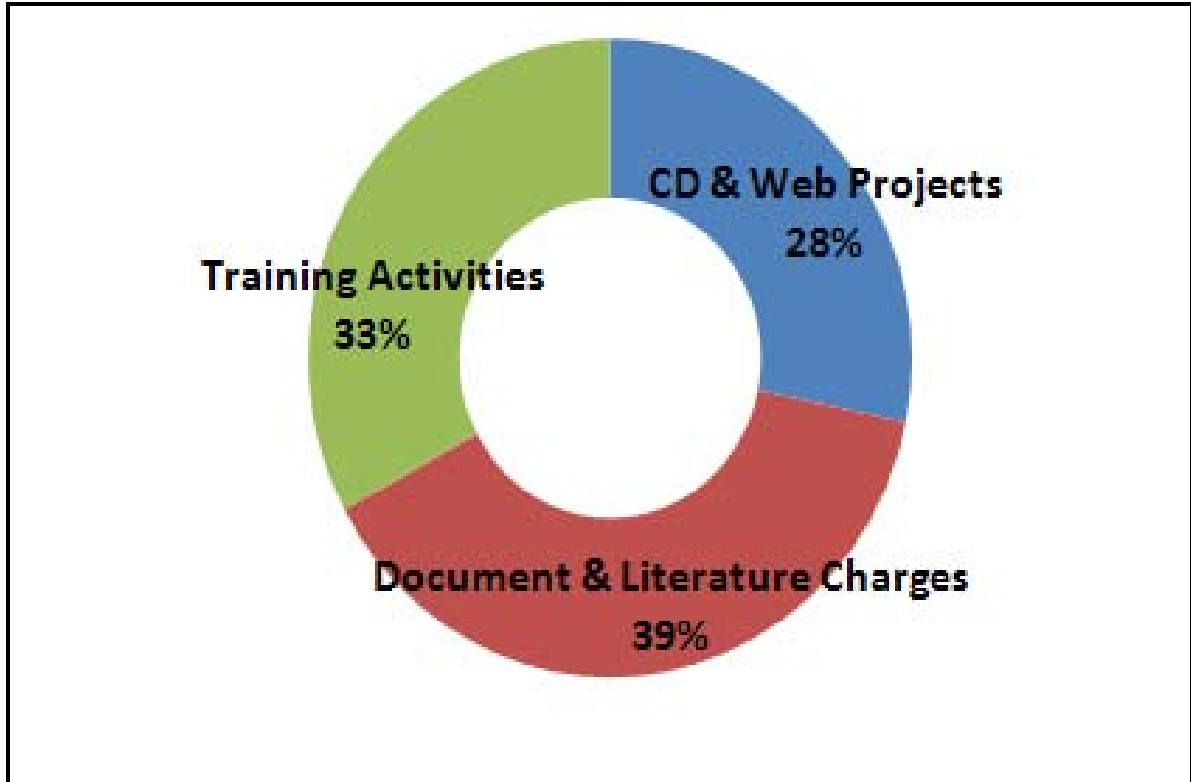
Other Income Relating to Trust Objectives %
