

From the CEO's Table

Welcome to the Annual Report of QMed Knowledge Foundation for 2019-20. Our "Learn with us" initiative grows steadily. This year we were thrilled to have started our institutional workshops in AIIMS Bhubaneswar, and soon followed by one in an ICMR institution in Bhubaneswar. What was special about these? The invitation to AIIMS came from the Director herself – after hearing a lecture I delivered in Mumbai. And as for ICMR, this is the first time any ICMR institution invited us to conduct a workshop. And some participants expressed their view that every ICMR institution should go through our workshop. We added two new online courses this year, and we had on board the Manipal Academy of Higher Education as our first academic institution to enable access to our courses for their faculty and students. Out of many lectures that I delivered this year, two that I did at an event for Nurses was special. More than 200 nurses participated in this event which was part of a program for their learning about systematic reviews. That is a great development indeed.

Last year we were saddened to lose one Founder Trustee – Dr Anand Shandilya in January. Dr Shandilya was a Pediatrician and a good friend. He believed that QMed was absolutely unique and told us never to forget that. And this was a really important boost to us in our early years, and now will remain entrenched in our hearts. We call ourselves a "Unique change making NGO". So this year we welcomed three new Trustees to strengthen QMed further. Two of them are former librarians who had also worked in medical institutions. And one is a Pediatrician in the Academic arena.

Any organization needs to constantly work at bettering its day to day processes. While we did work at it for all these years, this year we managed a big jump in this activity. We worked relentlessly to have processes in place to check every area of our website at least once a month, and update anything that needed to be updated. From August 2019, we ensured that every month's newsletter was up by the end of the month. We ensured a minimum of three blog posts every month. This year we also got our Annual report ready with details of all activities by the month of April 2020! (We put it online a bit later, as we had to adjust to the lockdown that was imposed in end March 2020.) With a team of only three working on all these areas, this is no mean task, and we are proud of having achieved this!

Rewards are always fun, and in the month of May 2019, GlobalGiving, through which we raise funds abroad, awarded us our fourth badge – for "Effectiveness" – which means that we have been constantly learning and improving. Sadly, this year we also had to face a problem where

GlobalGiving is unable to disburse donations to nonprofits in India who are raising funds on their platform. This is because the Home Ministry has put them on hold for some inquiries they are conducting. This meant that funds we raised were held up with GlobalGiving and were not readily available to us from July 2019 onwards.



While we are always grateful to Mediknit for having hosted our courses from 2018, we felt that we were ready to take things on by ourselves, offering us lots more flexibility to adapt to our participants' needs. I am delighted to share that Ms Fatima Shaikh single handedly created our site – www.qmedcourses.in – in record time. Ms Dipti Suvarna was my right hand for planning and revamping the courses. By end March we had all our working processes ready to go on our own.


