

## **From the CEO's Desk**

Welcome to the Annual Report of QMed Knowledge Foundation for 2021-2022. This was the second year of the pandemic. While we had done a lot during the previous year, (the first year of the pandemic), there was a lot we could not do. Mainly reaching our courses out to all those who needed it, because they were too immersed in managing Covid and its implications.

This year we wished to take a component of the National Medical Commission's document – "Competency based undergraduate curriculum for the Indian Medical Graduate" and sensitize every institution towards this. In Section 3.4.4 of this document, it specifies that every medical graduate must:

*Demonstrate ability to search (including through electronic means), and critically evaluate the medical literature and apply the information in the care of the patient"*

While this requirement is present in the document, it appears that it is not given enough priority. And we wanted to ensure that this happens. These elements (especially searching) is barely being taught and our Foundation teaches this in a way that everyone understands it well.

We did have some good happenings too, this year.

New institutions joined our courses – these were – Apollo Tele Health Services, AIIMS Kalyani, AIIMS Guwahati, JIPMER – Puducherry, Amirta Institute of Medical Sciences, Kochi and a Not for Profit called "Foundation for Excellence" that supports MBBS students financially.

We had renewals for AIIMS Bhubaneswar, the RMRC Bhubaneswar (an ICMR centre). Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, and Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College, Puducherry

A wonderful development this year was when the group of researchers – "Lancet Citizens Commission" (<https://www.citizenshealth.in/>) joined our courses. This large group had several small groups working on scoping reviews on different topics about healthcare in India. Each group went through specific sections of our courses in order to develop a comprehensive search strategy for their reviews. It was very heartening that researchers from well-known institutions mentioned that though they had been doing research for several years, they felt that they learned search strategies in detail only now!

*This is not surprising, because round the year through our site we had an online test that anyone could take. This was a fairly basic test on searching skills. Results showed that 60% of the people who attempted the quiz scored less than 50%*

The other development that made us feel good was that AIIMS Kalyani and Guwahati added their MBBS students to our QMedCourses subscribers. In fact I had an occasion to visit AIIMS Kalyani and deliver a sensitization lecture to the UG students there.

We added discussion forums on our courses platform to encourage discussions amongst participants. We also added “Resources for you” – a Library of Resources – useful for research in general, literature searching, medical writing and a selection of articles useful for research

This year we experimented with delivering Webinars on our own. We started with webinars only for our enrolled participants. Then we opened them to all. At first we had the events twice in a month. Then from January 2022 we do them every Tuesday and Friday. They have generated a fair amount of interest from all over India and occasionally international audiences too. We covered the gist of our courses – all in a month – and with this we sensitize attendees to explore the treasure of learning available in our courses

The less comforting aspect of our efforts is that only around 200 – 500 participants of our courses have completed one or more courses. This out a total of nearly 5000 enrolled. We are constantly seeing how we can motivate all to learn and our mini webinars are one such effort.

In March 2022, I attended an event in Jaipur – “International Workshop on Health Informatics Curriculum Development”.. The group present had discussed the need to have lots more skilled people in different areas of health informatics. I presented the aspect of Information Retrieval for medical research, academics and practice, the need to develop human resources in this area, and the capabilities that such trainees must develop.


Every medical college has undergraduate and postgraduate students who are doing some form of research. The faculty also does research for their publications, and they need to teach students. Practically all of them need these skills and are currently wasting time, when they do searches in an unstructured manner. All this will get addressed if the workforce gets such training.

The presentation was appreciated and discussed in some detail.

And so, the year ended with some personal interactions – much needed. We hope that the next financial year gets us far ahead with our mission of taking our courses and related offerings to several parts of India.





### **The courses:**

In the website – [www.qmedcourses.in](http://www.qmedcourses.in), we have two free courses, and the rest are open to individuals who make a nominal donation, or to institutions who subscribe.

The two free courses are:

1. Information Resources and Literature Searching
2. Introduction to Referencing

Both these cover the absolute must know skills in these knowledge areas. Without such basic skills, searching and referencing are most often wrongly done, sometimes actually ending up with wrong results / poor research. Keeping these courses free – we hope – leads to a large number getting their basics right.

### **A quiz that tests basic knowledge:**

On our website, we a link -“[Test your knowledge](#)” - a quiz that tests if people have these basic skills. The results show that 60% of those tested, get less than 50% score.




