

## **From the CEO's Desk**

Welcome to the Annual Report of QMed Knowledge Foundation for 2024–2025. This year has been one of sustained effort, deeper engagement, and meaningful recognition—reinforcing both the relevance and the impact of our work in strengthening evidence-based healthcare education in India.

A major focus through the year was the continued implementation of the **THIRST for AIIMS project**, supported by an educational grant from Pfizer. Under this initiative, we conducted structured, hands-on workshops on literature searching and referencing at several institutions, including **AIIMS Mangalagiri, HBT Medical College & Cooper Hospital**, and later at centres such as **AFMC Pune, INHS Asvini, ICMR Delhi, Tata Memorial Centre, and Seth GS Medical College & KEM Hospital**. These workshops enabled faculty, postgraduate students, and researchers to build essential competencies required for high-quality research and academic writing.

Alongside this, our outreach expanded steadily across diverse health disciplines. During the year, we conducted **21 webinars and lectures** and **17 intensive workshops**, reaching **over 11,000 health science students and professionals** across cities such as Mumbai, Pune, Ahmedabad, Delhi, Guwahati, Patiala, Vijayawada, and Dharashiv. Our sessions spanned medical, dental, nursing, physiotherapy, ayurveda, homoeopathy, pharmacy, and public health institutions—reflecting the broad relevance of structured literature searching skills across health professions.

Our **online learning platform** continued to grow, with **19 institutions and over 9,700 individuals registered** across **five core courses**. A key academic milestone this year was the successful launch of a new course, **Reference Management with Zotero**, which was warmly received by learners. Enrolments across all courses—ranging from introductory literature searching to advanced PubMed searching for systematic reviews—highlight the sustained demand for structured, methodical training in these areas.

One of the most humbling moments of the year for me personally was receiving the **Dr S. R. Ranganathan Lifetime Achievement Award** from the LIS Academy. This recognition is deeply meaningful, as it acknowledges not just individual work, but the broader vision that QMed has pursued for nearly two decades—bringing rigour, integrity, and clarity to medical information use, inspired by the legacy of the Father of Library Science.

None of this work would be possible without the continued trust of our institutional partners, the commitment of our small but dedicated team, and the engagement of thousands of learners who repeatedly affirm—through their feedback and testimonials—the urgent need for these skills to be embedded within health sciences education.


As we look to the future, we recognise that the next phase of QMed's journey must be both bolder and broader. Strengthening our Board, creating a thoughtful Advisory Panel, and nurturing a community of champions—individuals and institutions who actively advocate for research integrity—will be critical to this vision. Over the years, we have built strong academic frameworks, reliable delivery systems, and well-tested processes, deliberately preparing QMed for expansion.

That expansion is no longer optional. Without scale, high-quality training in literature searching and referencing risks remaining confined to small pockets, while the larger ecosystem continues to struggle with weak searches, incomplete evidence, and avoidable research waste.

Our aspiration is to become self-sufficient by reaching a large volume of institutions and individuals who contribute a modest fee—small individually, but transformative collectively. Most importantly, we hope that every learner who engages with QMed's courses does so with seriousness and intent, applying these skills rigorously, so that Indian research does not merely grow in quantity, but rises decisively in quality, credibility, and global influence.







### Lifetime Achievement Award (2024)


Mrs. Vasumathi Sriganesh is the recipient of the Dr S.R. Ranganathan Lifetime Achievement Award (2024)


